

ATLANTIS

HUMANITY'S ANCIENT MYTH

This is a myth that has preoccupied people for over 2,000 years. It is the story of a legendary island that generations of explorers have searched for but never found. The account of an enchanted, rich, and powerful city that probably never existed.

Or did it?

It was the Greek philosopher Plato who started the myth of Atlantis in 360 BC, saying: "Before the estuary known as the Pillars of Hercules, there existed an island larger than Asia and North Africa put together. On this island of Atlantis, there was a large and splendid kingdom that not only controlled the island itself but many other islands and parts of the mainland. Sometime later, however, there came about violent earthquakes and floods and during one bad day and night the island of Atlantis disappeared by sinking into the sea." Plato was able to report more about this fertile island that had existed 9,000 years before his own time, explaining there was a magnificent capital city with artistically laid out dockyards and a powerful navy. Gold and silver are said to have been plentiful. Did Plato make this all up, or was there an earlier example for his Atlantis story? Did the people of Atlantis leave behind any traces? If so, then wouldn't these have been discovered?

SEARCHING FOR ATLANTIS

Adventurers and treasure hunters, as well as respected researchers and explorers have repeatedly searched for this sunken island, all in vain. Even the Portuguese and Spanish seafarers of the 15th and 16th centuries, who made many voyages across the Atlantic Ocean, were unable to find either Atlantis or remnants of such a place. This led people to think that Plato was wrong and that the island did not lie in the Atlantic but somewhere else altogether: maybe in the Mediterranean, Black, or North Seas, in the Caribbean, or even further afield in the Malay Archipelago. Or was Atlantis the predecessor of the Greek island, Santorini, which was indeed destroyed by a volcanic explosion in ancient times? Was Atlantis, in fact, not an island at all, but a city or a kingdom in Mexico, India, or the Antarctic?
